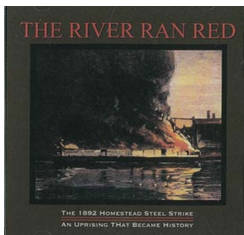


Party for a Potty! Benefit for FTCFTH and FNB

evoke the period, the film employs documentary techniques, primary sources, dramatically staged scenes shot on location in the Pittsburgh area, and lyrical commentary found in poetry, song and fiction. Memorial for Horace Vincent Alexander (May 17, 1924- February 22, 2016)

A son of Texas sharecroppers, Mr. Alexander became a prominent activist for peace with justice in the 50's. After organizing nationally with progressive luminaries, he landed in the Bay Area and was a CCSF engineering instructor and a mediator with SEEDS thru his late 80's. Mr. Alexander was a member of the 1st Unitarian Church of Los Angeles, under the leadership of Stephen Fritchman. He cut society's cold steel with a blade of stronger metal, guided by his ideals.
