
We have the honor of meeting Patience Mujeri who is visiting here from Zimbabwe. Patience will share her Zimbabwean culture and music.

Aesthetics Subcommittee Butterfly Effect: Migration is Beautiful



BFUU is displaying a social justice artwork in the foyer of Fellowship Hall. The Butterfly Effect: Migration is Beautiful project is an art and activism project led by youth in the Bay Area. They are leading a movement to create a visual representation that will raise awareness about the 15,000 immigrant children who have been and are currently in US detention and to inspire our community to take action to end child

detention permanently. They are working with the community to make butterflies out of recycled and upcycled materials. Butterflies will be displayed on strings hanging from old bike wheels, and displayed in public institutions including libraries, hospitals, schools, and city halls to raise awareness of children in detention.

Please join them at Lake Merritt Amphitheater on Saturday, November 16th, from 3-4 pm for a youth led rally to stand in solidarity with migrant children in detention. Suddenly I'm reading Jack Micheline's poem "Souls"

to his Grandpa Louie found the tiny handmade booklet hidden between big hard-backed tomes an exquisite work of art rough-textured and wildly colored signed by Jack

#48 in an edition of 200 pieces of his paintings inside a bumpy, tawny-colored cover like Jacob's coat of many colors.

There lay Jack's passionate poem to Grandpa Louie written on Yom Kippur in 1957
which is this week, but without the calendar
l would not have remembered

and my long-lost half-brother Jaymie son of our father Henry Smolens grandson of Ozer Smolenskin called me this week to say "Remember me? I'm your brother by Henry's third marriage."

And I found myself weeping with memories of the long lost the barely known
Ozer and Henry and Jaymie three generations of my Jewish family and Jack Micheline another Russian Jew who pushed a truck in New York's garment center when he was Harvey Silver a radical activist worker before he morphed into Micheline the poet and painter.

And I wept for myself and my Jewish heritage on Yom Kippur when I picked up Jack Micheline's tiny handmade book his passionate poem "Souls" dedicated to his Grandpa Louie wanderer, lover of life, lost soul like all of us.
