

Cleric's Corner



The Pareto Distribution

The Pareto Distribution is the name of a seemingly simple concept proven highly useful in several fields. We more commonly call it the 80/20 rule. It states, simply, that 80% of results are produced by 20% of causes. Put another way, it also points out that 80% of revenues are the results of 20%

of the sales force, or 20% of customers, or by that percentage of products sold. Conversely, 80% of a company's problems are in 20% of its systems.

The exact number need not be 80 or 20 when we look at several distributions. It may hover around 85/15, or it may drift to 78/22 for a description of an engineering principle.

What matters here is that this is not a human construct. The Pareto Principle¹ is not a human construct designed to manipulate the world; it is active in nature.

The Pareto principle is a core principle in economics, engineering, and many other fields.

The principle was developed and brought into modern focus by Joseph M. Juran, a management consultant in quality control and improvement, and named after an Italian economist, Vilfredo Pareto, who noted the 80/20 while at the University of Lausanne in 1896. Pareto demonstrated that 80% of the land in Italy was owned by 20% of the population.

So why should this principle matter to us? Why should it matter to the 99% or the 1%?

Can we use the Pareto Principle to personal advantage;² is it useful in daily life?³


