

BFUU SUPPORTS THE POOR PEOPLE'S CAMPAIGN DRIVE TO MOBILIZE TO TRANSFORM AMERICA IN THE IMAGE OF JUSTICE, TO CHALLENGE AND TO OVERCOME THE INTERLOCKING INJUSTICES OF SYSTEMIC POVERTY, SYSTEMIC RACISM, ECOLOGICAL DEVASTATION, THE WAR ECONOMY, AND THE FALSE MORAL NARRATIVE OF RELIGIOUS NATIONALISM. As Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. declared, "When profit motives are considered more important than people, it's time for the nation to undergo a radical revolution of values."

Rev. Barber has said that the United States' politics overwhelmingly focus on the needs of the middle class and the wealthy while ignoring the needs of the poor. We continue to hear the lies of scarcity, but there is no scarcity in a country where you have a \$22 Trillion gross domestic product.


The PPC has spent the last four years growing a campaign to be a movement that marches, that lobbies, that engages in civil disobedience, and that takes bus tours to impacted communities to converse directly with the poor and low-wealth people of America. By talking with those affected, hearing their stories, and helping to amplify their voices the message has been refined and shared throughout the world.

Workers are now busy preparing for the Mobilization Tour's Los Angeles stop on May 16. On that day, PPC National Co-chairs Reverend William Barber and Reverend Liz Theoharis will be with us in downtown Los Angeles for an highly anticipated, energizing, not to be missed transformative event. This gathering leads to the June 18, 2022, Mass Poor People's and Low-Wage Workers' Assembly and Moral March on Washington and to the Polls.

As The Rev. Clark Olsen, BFUU's pastor at the time of the Selma civil rights march in 1965, when he survived the attack that fatally injured the Rev. James J. Reeb, urged, "Whenever you see injustice, speak up, take a stand, be in solidarity. You never know what may be the outcome."

Please let your presence speak for you against injustice by joining us in Los Angeles on May  $16^{th}$  and in Washington on June  $18^{th}$ .

# UUA Tapestry of Faith



#### BFUU 2022 WorshipTheme:

#### "Exploring BFUU as a Community of Spiritual Practice."

In 2022 we are engaging with the UUA Tapestry of Faith <u>Spirit in Practice</u> workshop series developed by <u>Rev. Erik Walker Wikstrom</u>, which focuses on eight "Spheres" of spiritual practice (inspired by the Eight Gates of Zen model developed by the <u>Zen Mountain Monastery</u> in Mount Tremper, New York.)

Our theme for May is the second Sphere: Communal Worship Practices.

Although Unitarian Universalists affirm the uniqueness and individual nature of a person's spiritual path, our UU movement is also founded on a belief that community is essential to that journey. Regular engagement with communal worship—the ongoing and collective search for truth and meaning—is one way of supporting this belief.

#### **Try This at Home**

Choose a special time to be fully present with a community worship service, at BFUU or elsewhere—any group or organized ritual where your spirituality might be nourished. If you are a regular attender, be extra focused for this one. Remove or release distractions. Allow the words, music, arts, and community of a worship service to reach you, ministering to your deepest self in all its joys and sorrows.

Journal about the experience afterwards, describing the ways that worship has nourished your spirituality, in this instance or in other instances.

Reflect in your journal on these questions:

"How does participation in communal worship enhance my spiritual journey?"

"How does the participation of my spirit affect the experience of the group?"

Talk with friends, family, co-workers, or housemates about significant spiritual experiences they have had (or have longed for) in community worship or ritual. Tell them about your experiences and longings.

# BFUU Survey May 2022

As BFUU enters the transitions and unknowns of 2022, I have heard a variety of hopes & fears expressed by our members. "When can we go back to 'normal'?" "I miss hugging on Sundays!" "But what about the good parts of 'Zoom church' – are we going to lose those?" "Maybe we can put the chairs in a big circle?" "I don't want to go back to the hall; can we just meet on Zoom forever?" "Our leaders are bone tired – maybe it's time to just close down the church for good, while we still have the power to do it gracefully?" "How can we return to the joy of singing together, to hearing the healing music of our blended voices?" "What's the best way, now, to express our love for our BFUU community?" So many hopes & fears, ideas & questions. May we continue to listen deeply, to each other and to the Greater Wisdom, as we discern our pathway and next steps for our beloved BFUU.

Many BFUUers have wondered about how we can sustain and deepen our connections with one another, whether our Sunday worship stays on Zoom or not. And our 2022 worship theme is "Spirit in Practice," a Tapestry series designed to guide UUs in an exploration of spiritual practices together. We are considering the creation of a Small Group Ministry ("UU Talking Circles") program, where each BFUU member would be invited to join a facilitated small group. One hour a week of spiritually connecting with other BFUUers, outside Sunday morning.

The envisioned Talking Circles would meet over Zoom, share a common structure and topics, and focus on a different spiritual theme from Tapestry each week. Members would be encouraged to commit to attending for a period of four weeks before leaving or switching groups for the next round.

We ask all BFUU members, attenders, and interested folks to fill out this survey to help us in the planning of our 2022 worship programs, large or small.




