## Faith in Action East Bay

Dear folks,

After many years of lobbying the Alameda County Board of Supervisors-ACBOS, an Interfaith rally organized by Faith In Action East Bay-FIAEB was held on May 24 to end the mismanagement of Santa Rita Jail.



- The Supervisors -ACBOS,- have been delivered an ultimatum to begin supervising the horrible conditions at Santa Rita that has been run by the current Sheriff Ahern who has been on the job for 16 years. He is up for re-election this year. Check out the ICJJ website: <a href="https://www.icjjalamedacounty.org">www.icjjalamedacounty.org</a>
- There have been 58 deaths since 2014. Murders, suicides, as well as illness, have occurred and badly handled including late notice or no notice to relatives of the people who died. 49% Black, 28% Latin.
- The "Interfaith Coalition for Justice In Our Jails-ICJJ" has been established to pursue the objectives of this rally. See their website: <a href="www.icjjalamedacounty.org">www.icjjalamedacounty.org</a> for details.

- As BFUU's representative to **FIAEB** I was pleased today to be able to attend and be in the faith leadership group on stage with my BFUU-SJC tee.
  - Virginia Hollins-Davidson was also there and has participated in this movement.
  - Virginia and I have attended many meetings of the ACBOS since 2012 with the Justice Reinvestment Coalition of Alameda County-JRC/AC <a href="https://www.jrcofac.org">https://www.jrcofac.org</a> fighting mass incarceration of Black and Latino prisoners.
  - Many other UU congregations were present. With this action we are fulfilling our commitment to the new Principle #8!

Hopefully BFUU/SJC can continue to support this campaign.
